About the Course

This is the Varsity Theatre Class! Students' primary objective is the production of at least 2 main stage plays including: Fall Show/ Musical and UIL One Act Play Competition as well as our Dinner Theatre Fundraiser. Students will be responsible for ALL aspects of play production, including but not limited to: Acting, Directing, Stage Combat, Choreography, Set Construction, Obtaining or building props, Obtaining or Constructing costumes, Designing and printing all publicity, Hanging and focusing light plot, Editing and running sound cues etc.

Students will also be required to participate in Auditions, Play Analysis, Rehearsals, Performance and Reflection for each production.

All students enrolled in this class are required to participate in ALL main stage shows in some capacity. Students who are unable to be a part of the shows for one reason or another will be required to attend a performance or a rehearsal and write a critique over the show as a test grade, along with alternative class assignments.

As a reminder, participation in this class includes the OAP contest and Fall Shows which are considered Extra Curricular. Grades need to be passing in ALL classes in order to participate in these productions. Think about it like football. Students who don't pass, can't play in the games on Friday.

Attendance and Participation

Your attendance and participation in EVERY class and rehearsal is imperative! We can't play if all our team members aren't present. 3 unexcused absences from rehearsals will result in you losing your part in the show and subsequently could lead to your removal from the class. NO GUM ANYTIME! Remember: This class functions like football; if you don't go to after school practices you can't play in the game on Friday.

Grading

Your grade will be based on the following:

Dear Parent/Guardian,

I can't tell you how excited I am to have your son/daughter in Play Production this year! The Jim Ned High School Theatre Department has a long tradition of success and excellence!

With that said, I'd like to take a moment and fill you in on just what it means to be a member of the IVP. This is a Varsity Production Class, which like any varsity team, the fact that your child made the team is a testament to their talents and skills. So congratulations! However, with this honor comes great commitment and responsibility.

The IVP produces 2 main stage productions a year including our Fall Show/Musical and our UIL One Act Play Competition piece as well as our Dinner Theatre show, Drama Fest, etc. As a member of the IVP your student will be required to participate in all of these productions in some capacity. That does not necessarily mean acting on stage. A play, like an iceberg, has many aspects that aren't ever seen. Some of these areas include: Stage Combat, Choreography, Set Construction, Obtaining or building props, Obtaining or Constructing costumes, Designing and printing all publicity, Hanging and focusing light plot, Editing and running sound cues etc.

So, as you can see, there are numerous ways for your student to be involved. At the beginning of each production I will send home a **Rehearsal/Performance Calendar**. I request that you go over these calendars with your student and clearly mark ANY conflicts that you can see. This will ensure that your student and I are both aware of conflicts from the beginning and can better prepare for their absence. <u>NO STUDENT WILL EXPERIENCE ANY DIFFICULTY FOR A CONFLICT THAT IS MARKED ON THEIR CONFLICT CALENDAR</u>. If an emergency or a sickness arises I ask that **YOU** (not the student) please contact me and let me know. I am very good at working around as many conflicts as I possibly can!

Lastly, I ask that you and your student understand that like any sports team it is imperative that all team members be present for all practices and performances. Unlike many sports we do not have the luxury of a 2^{nd} and sometimes-3rd string of players. If your student is absent there is no one to take his or her place.

In this class your student will learn teamwork, patience, acceptance, dedication and creativity. They will use science, math, history, language arts, art, music, and physical education. They will develop communication skills, leadership, dependability and self-confidence. I thank you for allowing your student to participate in this class. It will change their life!
