Course Description

This course is designed to build upon the foundational skills developed in English I. We will continue to focus on **reading**, **writing**, **listening**, and **speaking** while introducing more advanced concepts such as rhetorical analysis and research skills. The curriculum emphasizes critical thinking, analysis, and effective communication across various genres and contexts.

Students will engage with a range of literary and non-literary texts, practice various writing modes (narrative, persuasive, informative, etc.), and refine their understanding of grammar, vocabulary, and research skills.

Some of the novels and texts we may read throughout the year include:

- Julius Caesar
- Antigone
- The Sword and the Stone
- The Call of the Wild
- Knights at the Round Table
- Various poetry

Core Focus Areas

- **Reading:** We will analyze literature and rhetoric, understand literary devices, and develop critical thinking skills.
- Writing: Students will master various writing modes, practice the writing process (planning, drafting, revising, editing), and develop research and citation skills (using MLA format, etc.).
- **Speaking and Listening:** We will focus on developing effective communication skills for various purposes and contexts.
- **Grammar and Vocabulary:** We will strengthen foundational language skills, expand vocabulary, and understand grammatical principles.

Grading Policy

- Assignments are expected to be completed in a timely manner. Students will be given
 ample class time to work on assignments. While I don't typically assign homework,
 students may have assignments to complete at home if they don't finish them in class.
- In the event of an absence, students will have an additional three school days to complete any missed assignments. It is the student's responsibility to obtain missed work. Assignments will be a mix of in-class activities and Google Classroom submissions.
- Students are allowed to correct or re-complete any **failing assignment** to improve their understanding and grade.
- Your final grade will be calculated as follows:

• Class Work: 70%

Quizzes and Assessments: 30%
