Course Description

This course is a study of **American literature**, with a strong emphasis on **literary analysis**, **essay writing**, and **oral presentations**. We will continue to build on the skills from English I and II, focusing on critical thinking, effective communication, and understanding the cultural and historical contexts of American literary works. Students will engage with a variety of texts and practice different writing modes to refine their analytical and argumentative skills.

Some of the novels and texts we may read throughout the year include:

- An Occurrence at Owl Creek Bridge
- Sinners in the Hands of an Angry God
- The Crucible
- Fahrenheit 451
- The Great Gatsby
- Of Mice and Men
- Old Man and the Sea
- The Pearl

Core Focus Areas

- **Reading:** We will analyze American literature, understand literary devices and rhetorical strategies, and develop critical thinking skills.
- **Writing:** Students will master various writing modes, with a particular focus on analytical and argumentative essays. We will also refine the writing process (planning, drafting, revising, editing) and continue to develop research and citation skills (using MLA format, etc.).
- **Speaking and Listening:** We will focus on developing effective communication skills through class discussions and oral presentations.
- **Grammar and Vocabulary:** We will strengthen foundational language skills, expand vocabulary, and understand grammatical principles.

Grading Policy

- Assignments are expected to be completed in a timely manner. Students will be given
 ample class time to work on assignments. While I don't typically assign homework,
 students may have assignments to complete at home if they don't finish them in class.
- In the event of an absence, students will have an additional three school days to complete any missed assignments. It is the student's responsibility to obtain missed work. Assignments will be a mix of in-class activities and Google Classroom submissions.
- Students are allowed to correct or re-complete any **failing assignment** to improve their understanding and grade.
- Your final grade will be calculated as follows:

• Class Work: 70%

Quizzes and Assessments: 30%
